This will be communicated via SMS system operating at the school. Please be aware of this as the safety of all is paramount on these extreme Fire Danger rating days.

To help us all keep an eye on the weather as summer begins, we will incorporate the Drummond forecast in our newsletter for the next week. This will also help you to make sure you are prepared each day for the weather conditions.
